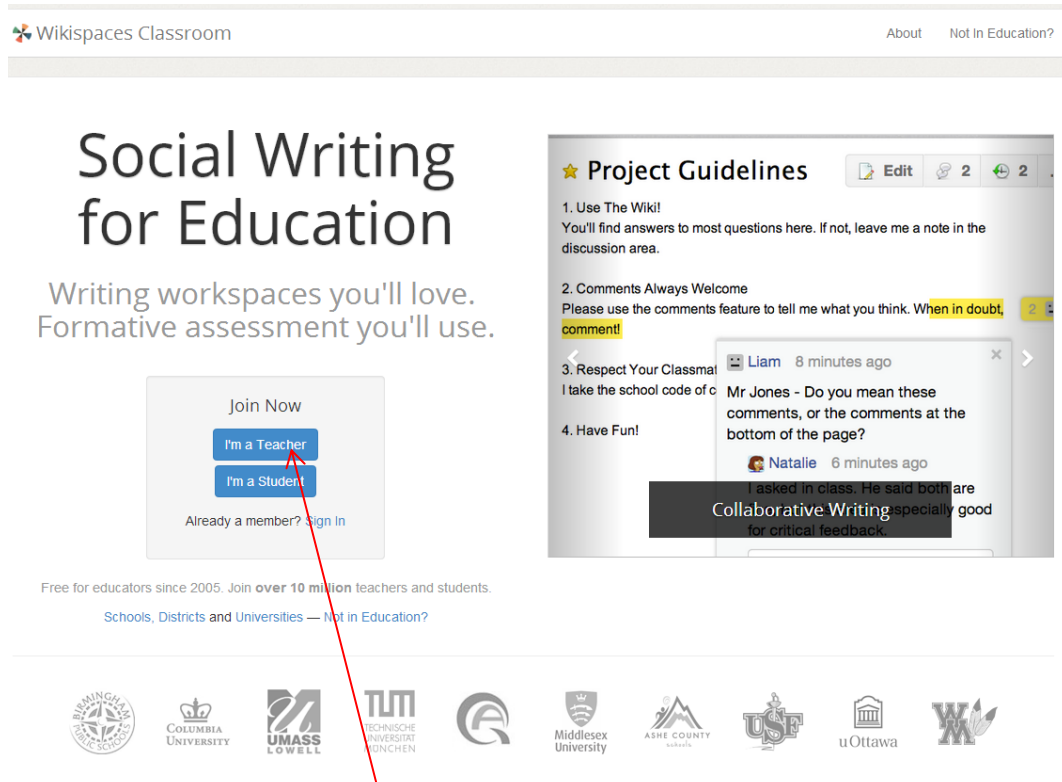


Creating a wiki account.

Create a wiki account


1. Go to <http://www.wikispaces.com/>



2. Click under Join now on "I'm a Teacher"
3. Enter a username (I usually use my first name and last name but you can use any name you want if it is available). Enter a password and an existing email. See example.

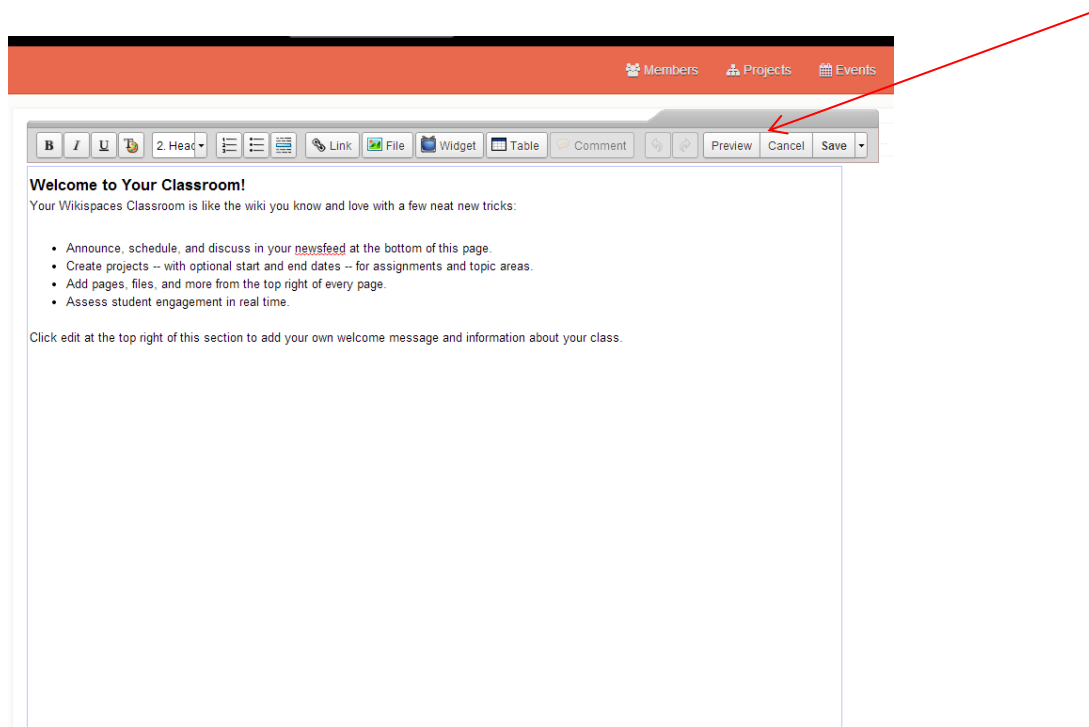
Editing your wiki

1. Start by editing your home page. This is where you need to say "what is this wiki about" and make it attractive by adding videos or pictures...etc. You can use your home page for also making announcements.

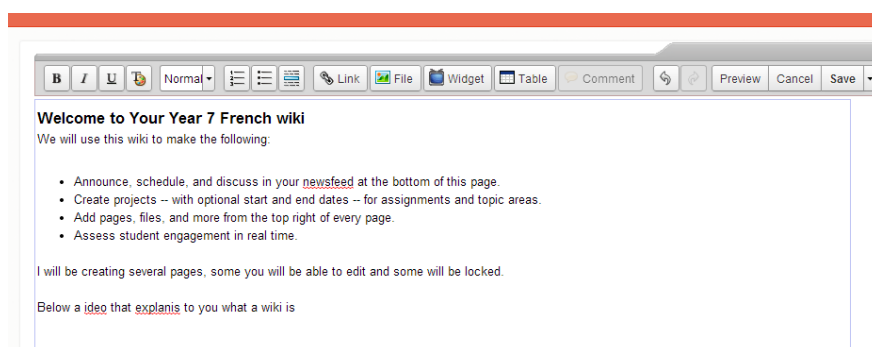
If you roll over your mouse to the top right corner of your page you can see an arrow click on it then you can click "Edit" to start editing your page. See picture below.



2. Pressing "Edit" will take you to the editing mode and then you can see a toolbar similar to the one you use in word.



3. Now type anything you want by writing inside the white space.
See example below:



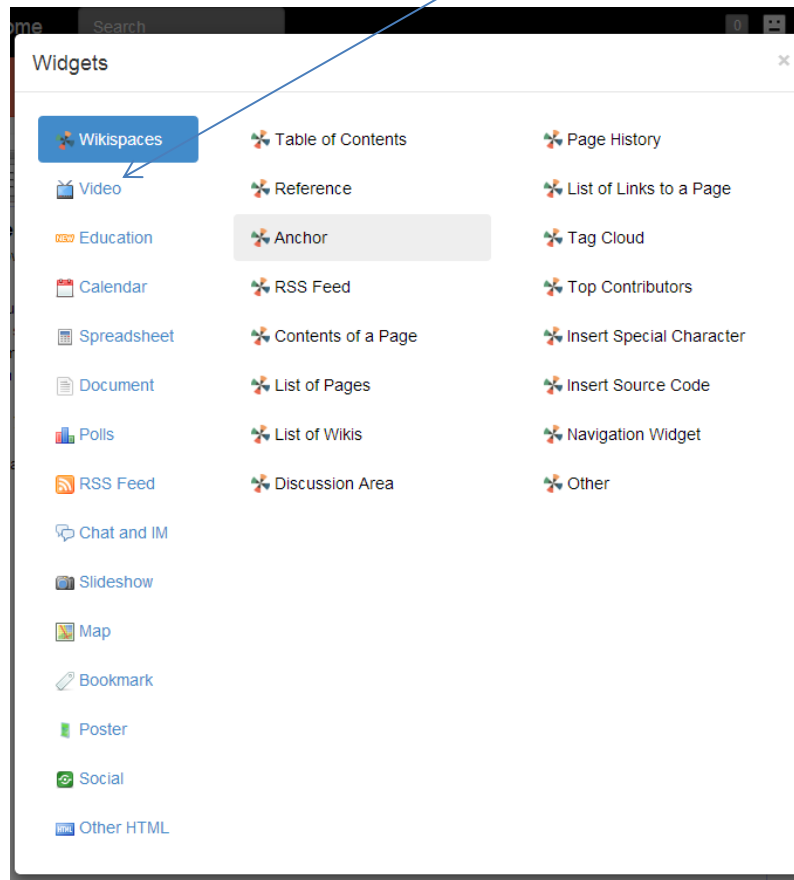
4. Now let's add a video. As an example I will add a video showing what wiki is. But for your classes you add a relevant video related to your topic. To add a video
- Go to the video location example YOUTUBE
 - Find the video you want
 - Search for the EMBEDDED CODE. See example below.

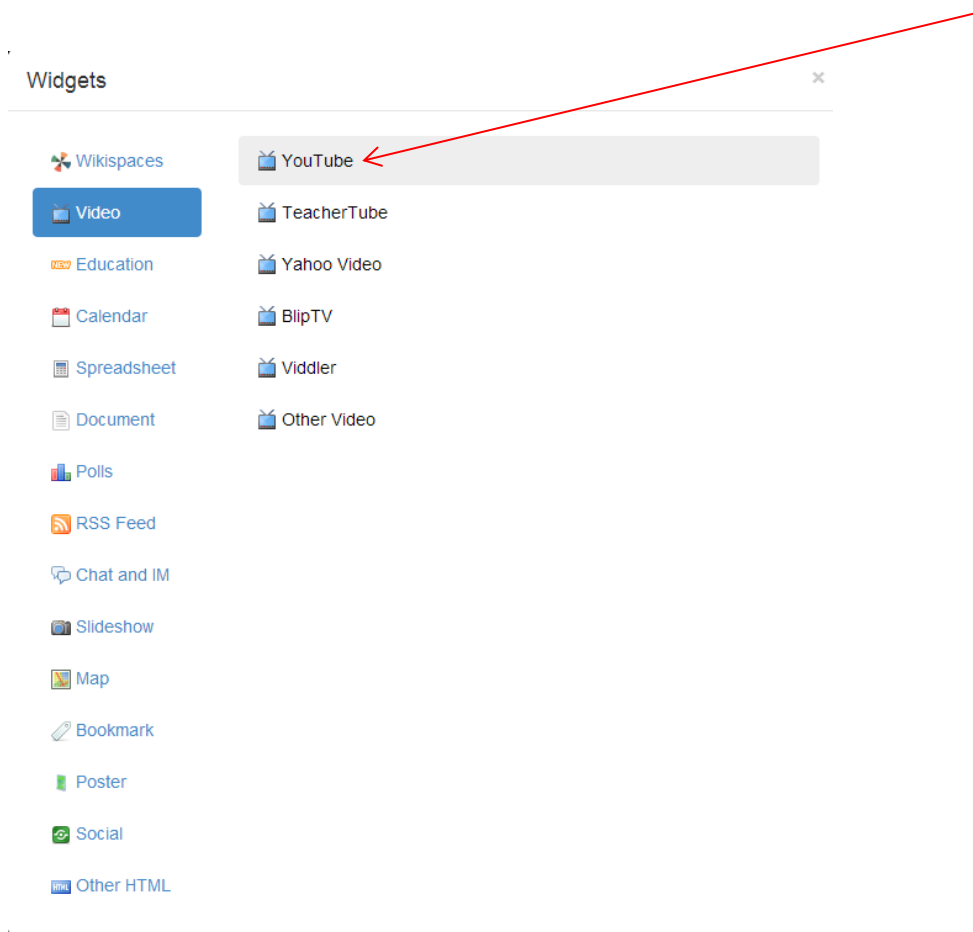
d. Copy and paste the code as per the example below.

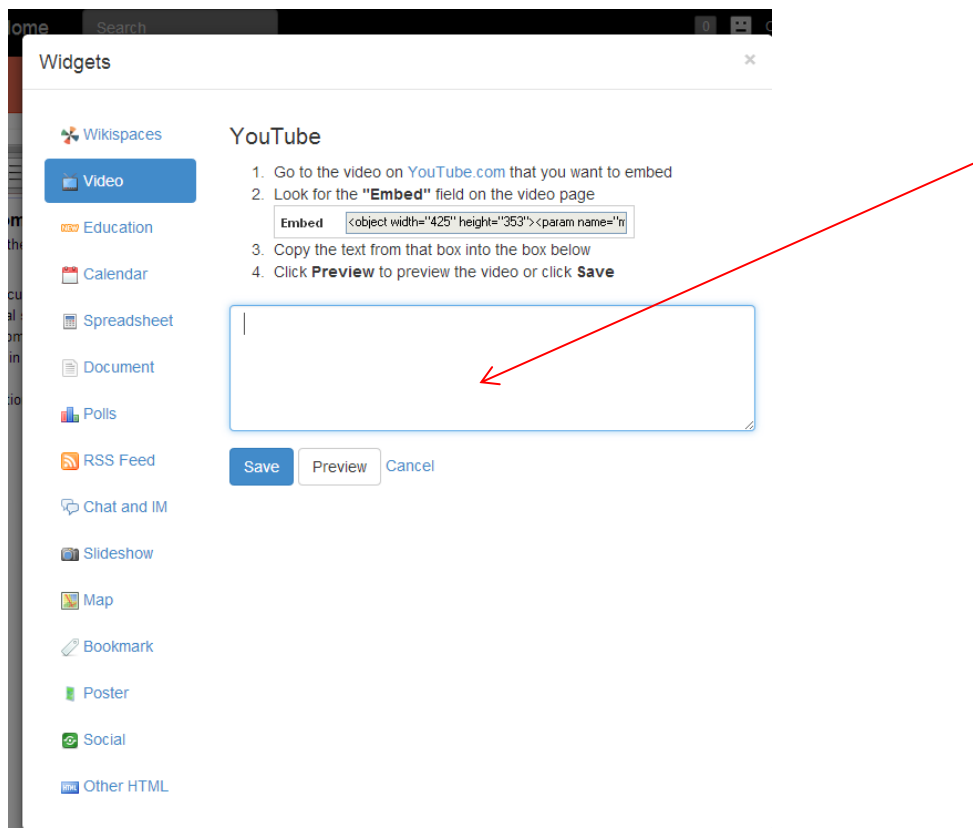
You will get this screen:

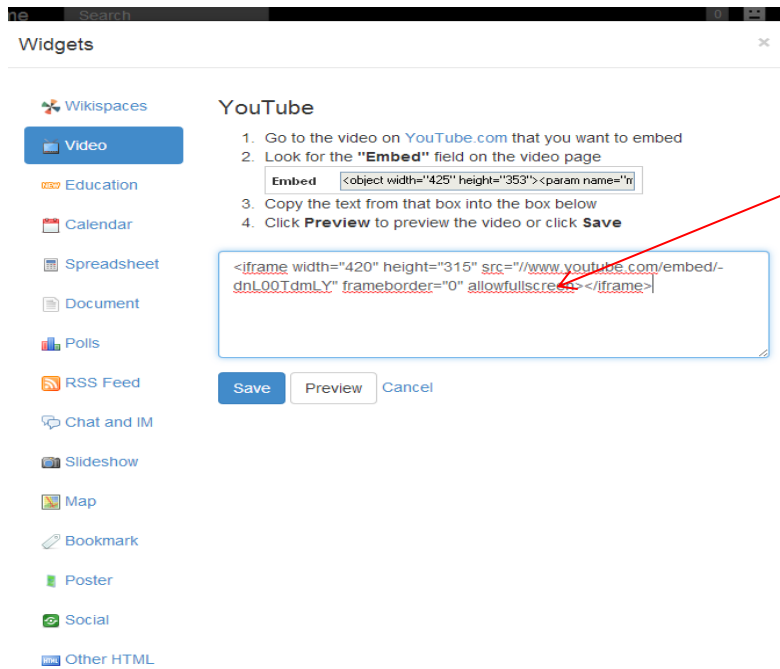


You want to add a video so click on Video as shown above. Then if it is a youtube video just click on Youtube video as shown below:

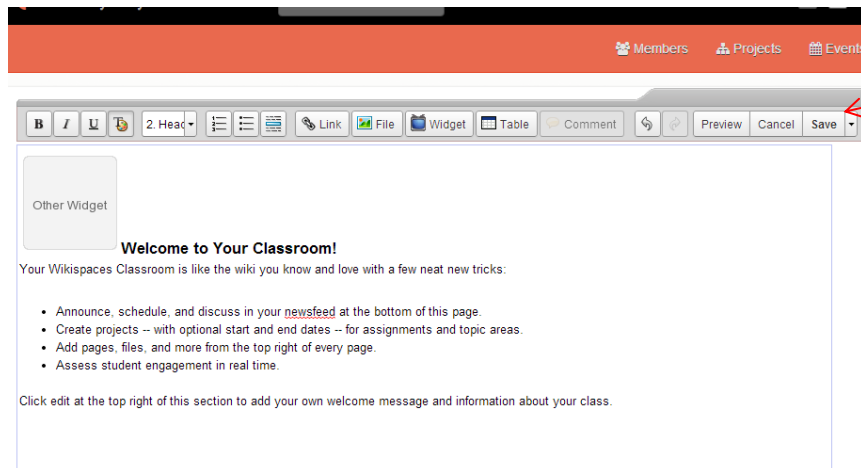


Then Paste the embedded code in the white box:

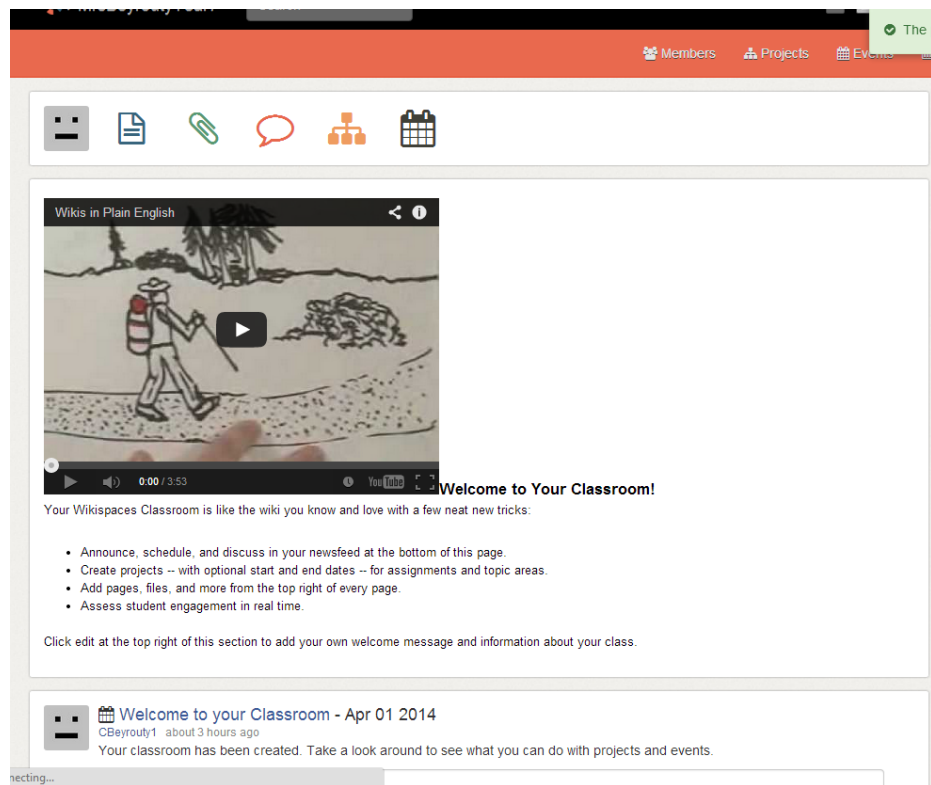




Then press SAVE. You will have this screen;

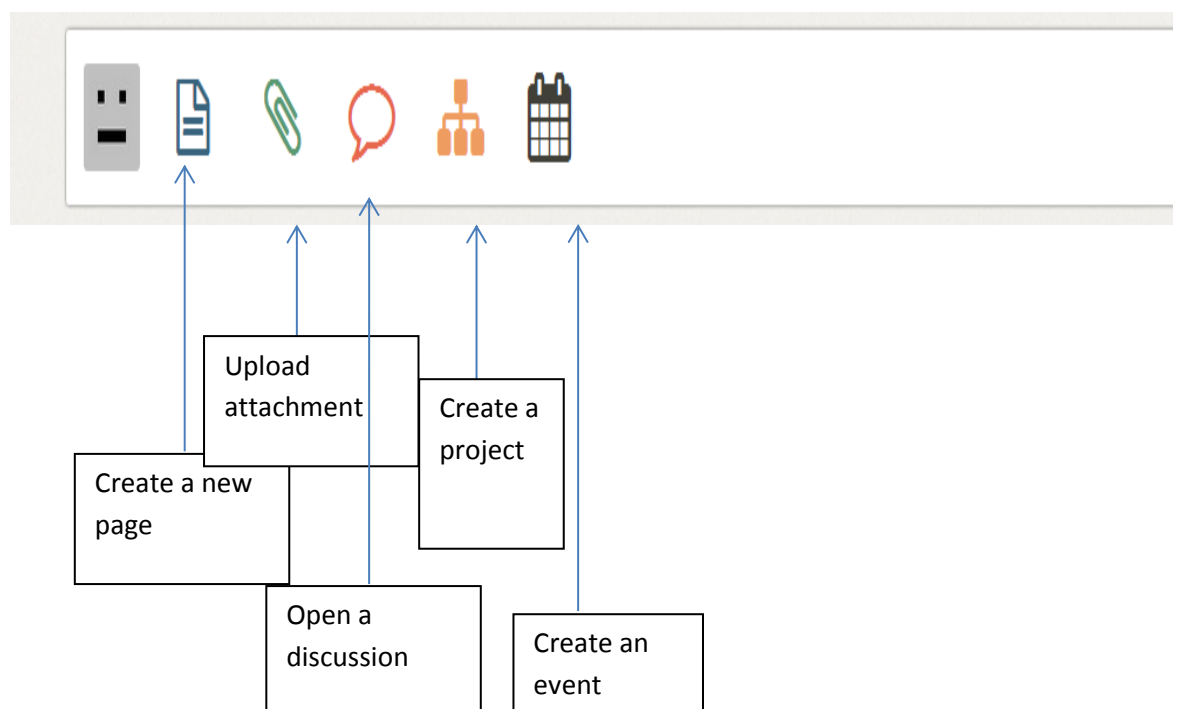


Press save and then you can see your video:
